

Establishing Context



Present context to all groups together.

- chose unique objective for each level
- use visuals
- address all students equally
- be aware of word choice
- elicit responses from all students
- use English only

Warm-up
Introduction
Presentation

Likeability

Present to each group in front of all students.

- create worksheets or handouts for each level, or
- find materials from different level materials, or
- set higher levels in cooperativelearning groups



Classroom
Management
takes practice
but in time anyone
can do it!

Likeability continued...



- present in more detail to the lowest level.
- give the lowest level practice and then observe and help the other groups.
