Know Your Students

Learner-Centered Instruction

- Learn names
- Ask appropriate personal questions
- O Use knowledge of students to plan lessons
- O Monitor progress

O Plan in advance based on student needs

• Follow your plan but be flexible

O Don't be satisfied until your students succeed Good

Why Plan? Importance for Teacher

- To focus activities toward objective
- O To have seamless progression from one activity to the next (within a lesson)
- To evaluate student performance
- To connect with preceding or subsequent lessons

Why Plan? Importance to Students

- To gain confidence that activities have a purpose
- To evaluate their own learning
- To apply what they've learned

Cooperative Learning Techniques

- Teach cooperative skills
- Group work and multilevel techniques
- O Techniques for helping students who need extra help

Cooperative Skills Interpersonal Skills

- Listening
- Paraphrasing
- O Checking for Understanding
- Resolving Conflicts
- O Building Consensus
- Expressing Appreciation

Cooperation Through Communication

- O Don't use sarcasm
- O Don't label
- O Don't over praise
- O Speak only when students are ready to listen
